**Habitat for Humanity of Greater Cincinnati, Ohio National, Eastside Coalition
Dedicate two Habitat homes in Avondale, OH**

01/09/2014 – Habitat for Humanity of Greater Cincinnati (HFHGC) will dedicate two homes built in partnership with Ohio National and the Eastside Coalition on Saturday, January 11, 2014. The homes, which represent part of the largest ever one-time gift to Habitat for Humanity of Greater Cincinnati, are the ninth and 10th homes built by Ohio National. “We are so proud to partner with Habitat for Humanity of Greater Cincinnati. Habitat for Humanity makes the dream of home ownership a reality for thousands of families across the United States and in our local community. Working together with our associates, we’re pleased to know we’re helping our Habitat partner families build a better future,” said Gary T. “Doc” Huffman, Ohio National’s chairman, president and chief executive officer. The dedication ceremony will begin at 10 a.m. at 3442 and 3446 Hallwood Place. The community is welcome to attend.

When completed, the home at 3442 Hallwood will belong to Tyc-Hannah Bangura and her son. “Buying my own home means a lot to me and my family because this home could stay in our family for a very long time,” she said. “It will hold memories that my kids and I can cherish and tell my future grand- and great-grandchildren about”. Next door at 3446 Hallwood will be Tyneah Harris and her two children. “Owning a home means everything to me and my family. This opportunity will give me a chance to show my children a stable foundation and also show them that hard work, dedication and faith really pays off! I can tell my children they can do and be anything and this home will be an example of this,” she said.

Ed Lee, Habitat for Humanity of Greater Cincinnati President and CEO said, “We are thankful for Ohio National’s generous donation and all of the efforts that went into building homes for these families. Ohio National has demonstrated that it is truly committed to the betterment of the Cincinnati community. Our collaborative partnership increases Habitat for Humanity of Greater Cincinnati’s capacity to address one of our city’s most serious needs – decent, affordable homeownership opportunities for hard-working families in need.”



In 2009, to celebrate its 100th anniversary and 100 years as part of the Cincinnati community, Ohio National Financial Services announced its commitment to fund the construction of 10 Habitat for Humanity homes over five years. Each Habitat for Humanity of Greater Cincinnati home sponsored by Ohio National symbolized a decade in its 100-year history. The \$780,000 gift funded two homes each year for five years from 2009-2013.
