who are we?

At Habitat for Humanity of Greater Cincinnati, we believe everyone deserves a safe, decent, and affordable place to live.

We are a nonprofit organization helping families build and improve places to call home. We believe affordable housing plays a critical role in strong and stable communities. We are an independent local affiliate of an international organization serving families across nine counties surrounding Cincinnati.

our mission

Seeking to put God's love into action, Habitat for Humanity brings people together to build homes, communities and hope.

what do we do?

- Affordable Homeownership
 - Habitat homebuyers build their home alongside volunteers and purchase their home with an affordable mortgage.
- Veteran Repairs
 - We partner with veterans and their families to provide critical repairs so they can remain safe in their homes.
- Aging In Place
 - This program is dedicated to assisting aging homeowners make their home a safe and comfortable place to live.
- Construction Training Program
 - A workforce development initiative designed to train and prepare individuals for careers in the construction industry.
- Rock the Bock
 - A fun one-day event that supports the home repair and neighborhood beautification goals of the communities where Habitat builds homes.







where do we come from?

Inspired by the national Habitat for Humanity movement, a group of local Christians founded the grassroots organization in Cincinnati in 1986. The early Cincinnati Habitat was entirely volunteer run with large involvement from local churches. Over the next few decades, several independent Habitat organizations across the Greater Cincinnati region combined forces. In 2013, the largest of these, Cincinnati Habitat and TriState Habitat, merged to become Habitat for Humanity of Greater Cincinnati.

Today, Habitat for Humanity of Greater Cincinnati is the largest nonprofit homebuilder in the region. Together with homebuyer families, donors, and volunteers we have built over 680 high-quality modest homes and completed over 140 critical home repairs for low-income homeowners in our community. We operate five Habitat for Humanity ReStores, home improvement retail stores that fund about a third of our work and keeps usable materials from landfills.

what is a faith coalition?

Habitat Cincinnati works a number of congregations throughout the greater Cincinnati area. We have organized these congregations into various coalitions so they can work together to strengthen relationships and build beloved community while serving families in need of affordable housing. There are denominational coalitions, geographic coalitions, and affinity coalitions.
